Feeling a little bit ancient just lately 'cos it seems that nearly everybody i've spoken to about Dusty - apart from all you good people on LTD - have heard of her, but know very little about her so my advice for them is to have a surf on here to put them out of their misery As i've also been thinking of doing a little tribute to Dusty to coincide with her first entry into the UK charts as a solo artist, back in November 1963, i thought it would be nice to do it in two parts. There's nothing new i will be telling long term fans, but hopefully they'll find something of interest, along with new fans, surfers and everyone else.

Part one takes a look at the Top 10 for the week ending 16th January '64 when I Only want To Be With You was at No.4 for the second week running - and where it stayed for another week.

Part two is a look at Dusty's singles that made the Top 10 during the sixties, and as we all know, this is only half the story.

## Part One

Here we go then. Dusty released I Only Want To Be With You on 8th November 1963, it entered the Top 40 as the highest new entry at No.25 on the week ending 28th November '63, a few weeks later she was up there at No.4 in mid' January '64. This is the Top 10 for that week.

Part Two

Dusty released many Top 20 singles during the sixties and here we take a look at the ones that made the Top 10, starting with I Just Don't Know What To Do With Myself which was released 26th June 1964, it was the highest new entry into the Top 40 at No.18 for the week ending 9/7/64, its highest position was No.3 (w.e 23/7/64) where it remained for 2 weeks. No.1 that week was A Hard Days Night -Beatles.

Losing You was released on 16/10/64, entered the Top 40 at No.38 (w.e 22/10/64), highest position No.9 (3/12/64). No.1 at the time was Little Red Rooster - Rolling Stones.

In The Middle Of Nowhere, released 11/6/65 entered the Top 40 at No.23 (1/7/65) highest position No.8 (29/7/65). No.1 that week Mr Tambourine Man -The Byrds.

Some Of Your Lovin' released 10/9/65, entered the Top 40 as the highest new entry at No.32 (23/9/65), Highest position No.8 (21/10/65). No.1 at the time was Tears - Ken Dodd.

You Don't Have To Say You Love Me, released 25/3/66, entered the Top 40 as the highest new entry at No.16 (7/4/66) and reached No.1 by 28/4/66. Knocked off the top spot by Pretty Flamingo - Manfred Mann the following week 🙉

Going Back released 1/7/66, highest new entry into Top.40 at No.30 (7/7/66) reached its highest position of No.10 (28/7/66) where it stayed for 2 weeks. No.1 the first week was Out Of Time - Chris Farlowe and the Thunderbirds, and the second weeks No.1 was With A Girl Like You - Troggs. http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=rJknm\_MQ2s0

All I See Is You, released 9/9/66, yet again Dusty was the highest new entry at No.19 (22/9/66), it reached its highest position No.9 (6/10/66) and the No.1 spot that week was Distant Drums - Jim Reeves.

I Close My Eyes And Count To Ten, released 28/6/68, it entered the Top 40 at No.31 (10/7/68), its highest position of No.4 was reached (14/8/68), the No.1 for that week was Fire - Crazy World Of Arthur Brown.

Son Of A Preacher Man was released 29/11/68, entered the Top 40 at No.24 (11/12/68) highest position No.9 (8/1/69), and No.1 at the time was Lily The Pink - Scaffold.

Thanks Sue. That 1964 Top 10 is just full of great hits. I looked at the charts of the Dusty Times a while back. Dusty was very powerful; it was the guys that got the big slice of the chart cake everytime. To see Dusty riding so high in 1964 is something very special and she would ride high all by herself many times. She was very special indeed.

Unfortunately I can remember liking 'Lily The Pink' and not liking 'Son of a Preacher Man'. But I was an idiot child then in terms of pop music! Those later charts show that a broad range of the UK population was buying singles. Just like now they would prefer sentimental tosh but many times in those good old music days they went for truly great classic pop records. ICMEACTT deserved to be No. 1 but 'Fire' was a record I was dancing to even in the 70s and 80s. SOYL is a record I'll listen to until the end of my days...and melt each time while Ken Dodd's 'Tears' (one of the UK's best selling selling singles) can take a hike!


