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



The deliciously, subtly, suggestively naughty 'Breakfast In Bed' is one of Dusty's sparkliest gems. It's almost as naughty as 'Pull Up To The Bumper' by Grace Jones (but, I hasten to add, in a very different way), and that's saying something. It's a song that winks at you from beneath the duvet, which is somehow a lot sexier than flinging off the duvet altogether.

Dusty's vocal is cool and knowing and sleepy and smokily seductive (it's those divine adlibs: 'come on over here...'), but those horns are so flagrantly raunchy they ought to carry a health warning.

I can't even entertain the notion of anyone else singing this. Dusty owns it absolutely.

And I am surprised indeed to hear that the Jackson 5 recorded 'Corner Of The Sky' as I am a big fan and ought to have known! I think that if Dusty had managed to pull together a complete vocal take, this song would have been a knockout. That said, I'm extremely grateful for what we have

No one has ever bettered the adult sexiness of Dusty's version of 'Breakfast In Bed'. I don't think anybody ever will now. You can hear a really sensual woman on this track. She's having fun here but talk about seduction! You would just have to take your shoes off!

It's only the reggae covers that capture a bit of the sexiness and they are both Dusty covers - they include most of Dusty's ad libs. I think the ad libs realy add a lot eg 'Ain't no need...', 'Hey Charlie' and 'Come on over here...'. OoooH Weeee!

Baby Washington sounds like she doesn't want to know what she's singing about; she probably didn't even want to sing this song. Shirley just doesn't take the time to give it some fire - tho' she was fully capable she throws the song away. Dusty chose to record this song on what should have been a best selling album.

Dusty is a revelation - she is on all the DIM tracks. We heard her sensuality on other tracks before this - the yearning and all that - but here she is being overtly seductive. I disagree only slightly with Rosie about Grace Jones. Dusty is so femininely seductive but we only hear the first movement. We learn later that if she doesn't get what she wants she starts yelling about Crumbs Off the Table! So whoever it is who is drying their tears on her dress better get themselves together...quick! What she's really saying is it's pull up to the bumper time!

'Corner of The Sky' is special because of the posthumous circumstances and because it is a rare and very poignant Dusty treasure. So, it doesn't matter who else sang it but it's kind of nice that the Jackson 5 did and now Michael has gone it fits him as well as it fits Dusty (tho' Micheal doesn't sing this solo). Of course the Jackson 5 sang it in a youthful way while Dusty adds gravitas and more meaning even in those fragments we have.

Dusty has a few connections to Michael. She covered the Jackson 5's 'I Want You Back' and Michael's version of 'I Wanna Be Where You Are' and Bill Wither's version of 'Ain't No Sunshine which Michael covered too. I read a reference to Dusty being so down on her luck that she was covering Michael Jackson songs. Well, that writer was a snob. These were and are great songs. But thank goodness Dusty finally got into Brooks Arthur's adult oriented studio even if it was just a little too late in the day.

say, 'In The Winter' or 'Exclusively For Me', it'd have been one of the highlights from those sessions. The Jackson 5's is certainly pleasant, but lacks the emotion of Miss Dusty's. Why do you think it's a mistake, Brian?

As far as showtunes go, I agree with you, Humboldt. The only reason I know WAIG and WCITT are show tunes is through the Dusty bible. They do stand on their own well, though I think the wordiness of WAIG gives it away as a show tune. The lyrics are more subtle in WCITT, and with the arrangement/rhythym having a Latin flavor to it, it takes it away from it's showtune roots just far enough.

Memphis, the Brooks Arthur article from DSB said that Mr. Arthur wanted to use singer/songwriter penned songs for his project with Miss Dusty. All the songs are in that vein except 'A Love Like Yours', written by Holland/Dozier/Holland, who to my knowledge, only wrote, and didn't sing. If I'm wrong, please correct me on that. I know that Stephen Schwartz, who wrote COTS, does sing his own compositions.

I do agree that 'Corner of the Sky' doesn't really fit in well with the general mood of the album, though. I love the song to pieces, but it's got a much more ambitious arrangement than the rest of the songs, which tend to be quieter and more introspective, though COTS does

contain some of the most affecting lyrics, the delivery (by anyone) doesn't lend itself to introspection very well.

Also, 'Angels', 'Make the Man Love Me' and I believe 'I Am Your Child' weren't finished as well, so I don't think Miss Dusty was reluctant to finish COTS in particular.

Memphis and Taylor

I think that 'Corner Of The Sky', while being not quite in keeping with the intimate, personal, introspective mood of 'Longing', isn't a complete mismatch - largely because of the lyrics (as you say Taylor) about finding your place in the world. That in itself warrants its inclusion. I find it much harder to make a case for 'A Love Like Yours', which is without question very out of place here. It's either an attempt to demonstrate that she was still capable of singing the hell out of soul like she did in the 60s (and bless her, dear Dusty, the '74 version of this song certainly doesn't provide evidence that this was the case), or an effort to provide a moment of respite from what may have been interpreted by some as a sombre, downbeat album. (Just to be clear, this isn't how I feel about it at all!)

Such a moment of respite is absolutely not needed. I feel very passionately about 'Longing'. I have to be careful about listening to it too often because it's so moving that I feel unsettled and disturbed for a while afterwards. And Taylor, I completely agree with you about not understanding why people don't like 'Corner Of The Sky'!

Hi Taylor. I think Dusty really wanted 'A Love Like Yours' whether it fitted with Brooks' ideas or not. This song seems to have meant a lot to Dusty. It doesn't sit totally comfortably on 'It Begins Again' either but this is the proof that Dusty really wanted to record the song. That's my feeling anyway.

Yes, the other songs weren't completely finished either. But Corner was too fragmented to come out on Beautiful Soul - that's what I meant to say. I hear Corner as a really good version of a well known at the time show tune. It's not a typical introspective singer-songwriter tune of the time even if Schwartz could sing.

Another clarification. I think a complete Dusty version would have been fine on Beautiful Soul because by then we'd forgotton where the song came from (I didn; t know it came from 'Pippin' until I looked it up on Wika) but back in the early 70s the audience might have wondered what this show tune was doing on the album. For me 'Angels' is the better choice for the album.

I'm quessing that not all the tracks Dusty recorded would have ended up on a completed 'Longing' album; a track listing would've been chosen and some tracks would have been left in the vault. I wish it had been that way.
