Irish singer Dana recalls a 1970 flight with Dusty in her autobiography All Kinds Of Everything (Gill & McMillan 2007)

She writes:

" I travelled back and forth to Europe a great deal. One one occasion, a number of the artists including Dusty Springfield and myself almost met our maker together. We were on a flight home from Germany after having taken part in a television programme, when suddenly the pilot announced that there was a problem with the undercarriage and we would have to fly over the control tower at London Heathrow so that they could do a visual check.

Apparently the computer had indicated that although one set of wheels was locked down for landing, the other was not. Dusty had been very good to me on that trip; my luggage had gone missing with my make-up in it and while she let me use hers, we reminisced about the time she toured Ireland with her brothers as The Springfields and my sister Eileen had been the support act at one of the venues.

Dusty didn't like flying and when the pilot came back on to say that we had a serious problem and we'd be making an emergency landing, she was obviously petrified. Dick Katz [Dana's agent] had been trying to keep her as calm as possible, but Dad noticed that Dick was now intently scribbling away on a sheet of paper. It turned out that he was writing his Last Will and Testament in the belief that if we did crash, someone would find it in his pocket.

It was a very sobering moment as we touched down, but thankfully the computer was wrong and both sets of wheels did lock down as we landed safely at Heathrow, with a full emergency turnout of fire engines and ambulances.

When we were safely on the ground, we all had a good laugh at Dick writing his will at such a moment and even he saw the funny side of it, but poor Dusty was in bits over what had happened and her fear of flying intensified after that."


