

The most recent evident online blurb touting a Sienna Miller Dusty-biopic dates from February. Sienna had a baby girl in July & -although she has four films in pre-release mode - she understandably has no reported projects on the go right now.

I recently commented at length (unusual for me I know o) on an article from May 2011 about the Ray Connelly-scripted Dusty biopic project which hypothesized 2012 "may well go down as the year of the music biopic": if you missed my post you can view it here: viewtopic.php?f=15&t=4247
Basically I updated the status of the projected music biopics cited in the article only one of which (about Jeff Buckley) has been made: the others seem to have stalled - perhaps forever.

I've also posted at length on the Whitney Houston film **Sparkle** which I predicted would be at least a qualified hit after it opened strongly. However it seems most interested parties went to see the film on its opening weekend as its box office take plummeted & **Sparkle**'s set to end its US theatrical run with a \$25 tally: while **Sparkle**'s moderate production costs of \$14 million mean it turned a profit which will no doubt increase significantly with its overseas release the film is essentially a non-event. The disinterest afforded **Sparkle** along with **Rock of Ages** being a big budget box office dud this past summer isn't likely to foster a cinematic climate agreeable to the production of any film projects which are musically based.
