Both had difficult times personally and professionally after the heady days of the 1960s (more so for KK I think). KK was IMHO one of the more interesting female artists of the 1960s. She occupied a slightly different musical berth to Dusty, perhaps more at home in the Springfields era.

'In many ways, Kathy Kirby and I are very alike. I don't know Kathy very well. We both have tremendous driving ambition. She has also battled very hard, for a long time, to get where she's got, as I did in my own way '.
