Let's see. If we do hairstyles, they all have a connection. Otherwise,Leslie Gore, Maxine Brown and Baby Washington did songs that Dusty covered. The Exciters were an early influence. The Beverly Warren song I linked to and some of the Cookies hits were written by Goffin-King.

There's a general connection to the Spector groups in that Stay Awhile was an attempt to copy Phil's sound.

Louise Murray was in The Hearts with Baby Washington (stretching a bit here) The Delrons went to Catholic school, like Dusty did. (REALLY stretching it here) Both The Toys and Dusty had their biggest hits by giving new lyrics to earlier compositions.

Can't think of anything for Arlene Smith, though. (Later edit: Turns out they went to Catholic school, too, so I think that's everyone.)

I wonder if they asked Genya Raven/Goldie to be there?
