Hi.

I noticed your item of Dusty Springfield's last phone bill for sale.

I realise the proceeds are going to charity - and to try to raise money for the animal sanctuary Dusty supported is a very laudable thing to do.

One thing I am concerned about is that you say the bill contains 6 pages. I assume the subsequent pages (other than the first one) will contain all the usual information of all the numbers dialled.

Well, I got the response we wanted first thing this morning. She said:

"Dear Fraser, I have taken note of your very valid point and removed the 6 pages. Thanks"

It's only the first page that's for sale now - and the message about their being 6 pages has been removed from the ebay site.

Birdie - I realise she possibly wouldn't have made many of the calls - if she was ill, she probably wouldn't have felt like calling a lot of people - and that the calls would have been from Simon or the nursing staff. My problem was that the period concerned covered the night she died - and there would probably have been a lot of calls made that night to close friends. If the bill had fallen into the hands of an obsessive fan - it could have made trouble for Dusty's "inner circle", if they still have the same phone numbers as they did in 1999 (and, if they haven't moved house since - in all probability they will, as peopele don't tend to change their phone numbers in the UK unless they have to).

There may have been a greater number of incoming calls to the number during this period - but they don't show up on the bill anyway - so that wouldn't be a problem.

I have to say, I find it all a little macrabre - but am not really THAT surprised by it

Anyway, things seem to have sorted themselves - and the remaining pages have been taken off the listing of what's for sale.

Oh - and I've just noticed, that was my 600th post!
