

Jan, was Reputation Dusty's last hit in the German charts?

Hi Clive,

no, "Reputation" was not her last hit in the German charts.

In 1995 she reached the charts again, this time with "Wherever Would I Be", spending 10 weeks in the charts, reaching no. 73 if I remember that correctly.

The album "A Very Fine Love" didn't chart here, but the album "Reputation" reached no. 21, spending 12 weeks in the charts.

Her biggest solo hit of "recent time" (of course she charted with the PSB and "WHIDTDT", reaching no. 4) definitely was "In Private" (no.4, 30 weeks in charts), followed by "Reputation" (no.29, 17 weeks in charts).

"Nothing Has Been Proved" charted as well, peaking at no.52. But as we have the "Top 100" that is not so bad.

You see, I always wonder why only the UK charts are listed in booklets or books, as the German market is (besides UK and US of course) the biggest music market, so a song can also be considered a hit when reaching a good position over here, even if it did not do too well on the UK charts.

It was also the second (and last) time she performed 'Soft Core' in public. The first time was in 1986 at a farewell concert for Rough Trade in Montreal. Incidentally, 'Soft Core' is the only song from 'White Heat' she ever performed in public.

Clive, just as a trivia tidbit for you, Miss Dusty's last solo chart entry in the US was with 'Silly Silly Fool' in 1970 at #76. She next charted in the Billboard Hot 100 nearly twenty years later with Pet Shop Boys and 'What Have I Done To Deserve This?' in 1987 at #2; that was her highest chart placing ever in the US, and to my knowledge, the last time she charted here. WHY 'In Private' and the 'Reputation' album were never released here, I'll never know.


