I've just been through some of my old Dusty files from the mailing sites. I didn't have time yesterday. They brought back a lot of memories about why I stopped signing in. Just after Dusty's passing there was a lot of rancour and I have to say, nastiness, on some Dusty sites. People criticised Fred Perry and then they stood up for him. People pilloried 'Faye Harris' and she never came back. I'd joined the lists after all this had happened. Here's a message from Faye just after Dusty's passing. She must have been grief stricken but she was run off the site. Please don't reveal 'Faye Harris'. If she wanted to be out I'm sure we'd have heard more from her by now. All I know is she did a lot of good for Dusty but there came a point when she couldn't take anymore. I've asterisked some names just in case...

"Dear Dusty Fans,

I have been Dusty's close friend for 27 years. In addition to \*\*\* monitoring \*\*\*, I, too was watching for her. I hardly know where to begin. Dusty was a very private person and NEVER wanted anything discussed that was personal. She was always like that. It had nothing to do with her being sick. But when she did get sick, she was even more adamant about it. She made me promise never to write about her in any way, in any medium, but I know she wouldn't mind some praise. She was so touched by what all of you wrote and how much you respected her and her music. She was really knocked out that this list was so active. It was very frustrating, and at times heartbreaking for \*\*\* and me to truly know what was going on and read what you were chatting about, oblivious to her real health status--but it was what she wanted.

I feel OK about telling you of her strength and courage. It's all right for you to know that she was always sicker than was ever revealed. It was known to our very, very tight-knit inner-circle that the end would always be this terrible result. DUSTY DID NOT KNOW THIS for the longest time, and really lived happily and with hope for some time. But she was one of the brightest people I've ever known, and about 13 months ago she figured out the truth. Without going into details in order to respect her privacy, the last year for us has been one of many times not knowing if she would be with us the next day. It was at those times when it was so hard to read [your posts], for all of you had no idea of our pain.

Again, I want you to know that Dusty, up until about two weeks ago was still regaling nurses and doctors with her sense of humor. Once she knew it was going to be a horrific fight she fought harder. She never gave up because she loved life so much. She fought with grace, style, dignity, and I have even more respect than before. If you notice I'm deliberately leaving out details as I promised her.

I doubt very much whether I can answer many of your questions without breaking my promise to her. I will answer some obvious ones that would be OK with her without details 1. Yes, I went to England and saw her. 2. Yes, she did personally get and hold the OBE 3. Yes, fabulous arrangements have been in place for the Rock and Roll Hall of



I'm using her pseudonym because the last time I read about her at any length was in DWD which was published in 2000 - she didn't want to be named publicly.

I posted the text for information purposes and for people who hadn't seen the post before. The words are straightforward and they were good and comforting to read when I found them. There's nothing controversial except we now know the strong words about privacy didn't take long to bite the dust. And I find the vehemence about 'authorisation' a bit too strong.
