I believe the only known surviving "masters" for these tracks are Jeff Barry's own stereo mixes for what were intended to be the final versions of the songs for the album.

There may be surviving mono and stereo masters for pilot/buzz singles "Haunted" and "I Believe in You" plus "I'll Be Faithful" and perhaps surviving stereo masters of bsides "Nothing Is Forever" and "Someone Who Cares".

Master tapes for the remaining tracks (along with Memphis era recording "To Love Somebody") were believed to have perished in the 1978 Atlantic Records storage facility fire in Long Branch, NJ.
