As you seem to be something of a mastermind when it comes to this album, I'm hoping that you might know a little something about matrix numbers.

My gatefold copy of Cameo has no proper matrix numbers: it just has

DSX 50128 - A - 1B

hand-etched into the run-off. Is yours like this? Google is not being terribly helpful in this regard, and I'm curious to know more about my small amount of Dusty vinyl as I think they're nearly all early or first pressings.

Mine has DSX 50128 A2 on it on Side A and DSX 50128 B2 on Side B...that's about it. The DSX 50128 is the album's catalogue number, I'm guessing that the A and B are for the respective sides of the album they're on, and the 2 must mean it's a 2nd pressing. That's my listening copy. I have a sealed copy of the ABC/Dunhill (gatefold) 'Cameo' so I can't tell what numbers are on it, and an unsealed copy of the UK Philips 'Cameo' and the Aussie Philips 'Cameo', both of which indicate that they're 1st pressings. I'm not sure if the gatefold copy of 'Cameo' I gave Memphis is a 1st or 2nd pressing. Perhaps ABC/Dunhill only pressed their records with the album's catalogue number, Side, and pressing number.



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

My copy has the matrix number only with A & B respectively on either side.

On a trip to Australia a few years ago I was delighted to find four old Dusty albums in mint condition one being Cameo but in the centre was an actual picture of Dusty.

As for lyrics being printed inside Dusty's album sleeves, the Japanese albums always included a lyric sheet which was often quite funny to read as they sometimes got the odd word wrong.

As for the matrix numbers being hand etched, I think most of them were.

Also the picture above of the album labels, the one on the left must be a late pressing as the label has been changed too a more modern design - my copy has the label on the right.
