Marta Kubišová was one of of the top Czech vocalistes of the '60s: she cut a number of local covers of English-language hits including *It's Not Unusual, These Boots Are Made For Walking, Walking Back to Happiness* & - shown below - *Anyone Who Had a Heart*: [youtube]http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=tWEA5N-z2S4[/youtube] In 1968 Marta became part of a mixed-gender vocal group called the Golden Kids who it's been speculated could have filled the Europop niche eventually occupied by ABBA. However by 1970 Marta had fallen afoul of the Communist regime occupying Czechoslovakia & her singing voice was virtually silenced until the Iron Curtain lifted on Czechoslovakia at the end of 1989.

Helena Vondráčková, who (along with Václav Neckář) was Marta's partner in the Golden Kids, also cut local covers of several English-language hits including *I Only Want to Be With You* & *What's It Gonna Be*: Helena escaped the censure which Marta suffered to this year is celebrate he 50th year of a singing career whose highlights would seem to justify the sobriquet she's often assigned of "the Czech Streisand".
