Dear Irish TV

I was hoping that as a member of a media company you would be aware that the majority of all of Dusty's performances are under various governmental copywright regulations and must be licensed to be included in your documentary.

Even certain internet images are protected by copyright, and if you are in violation, you and your company can be sued for license enfringement. To avoid forthcoming issues from media and entertainment companies, I'd suggest you contact the resident guru on these things, ie, Paul Howes, author of the Complete Dusty Springfield and producer of several CDs or Dusty performances. I am sure he will direct you to the appropriate contacts at The BBC and Universal Music.

Alas, licensing fees are expensive may not be suitable for your documentary budget.

Also, most YouTube videos are in violation of various copywright laws.
