Are you sure this is our girls Baker Street flat? The front wall appears to be a bow fronted bay window (this could be an illusion created by the camera lens). If it were a straight wall that right hand corner would be a plain 90% return. In this case the corner appears to be more complicated (were the table is tucked in against the wall). This would have been done for a reason i.e. to cover the the inside of the brick work of a bay window were it is jointed to the front wall. There are no bay windows on or around 113 Baker Street. It is highly unlikely this would have been altered over the years. Of course I could be wrong Im no expert! Also If you look out of the window you notice the buildings across the road are not directly across from Dusty's flat. As would be the case if it were in the 113 building. (Phew! I need to go and lie down for a while, I'v given meself a headache with all that!)

The plaque on Aubrey Walk was placed by the Heritage Foundation, this is different from the more famous English Heritage who have a different set of rules. The more official English Heritage has been running for many years and they have a rule that the person being honoured has to have been dead for at least 20 years or has reached the centenary of their birth. The person does not have to have owned the house, just lived there. They could decide to put a plaque on Lauderdale Mansions, Baker St, Westbourne Terrace or any of the other London addresses if they wish. As for The Heritage Foundation, I did ask David Graham why they didn't put a plaque up on Baker St instead of having another ceremony for a replacement on Aubrey Walk, and he actually liked the idea but said Westminster council were difficult to deal with. Maybe they're more agreeable with English Heritage.
