i just had a chance to review the charts a bit more in-depth and a few observations.

-It's usually noted that Dusty was the 2nd British act after the Beatles to enter the Billboard chart. On Cashbox IOWTBWY entered ONE WEEK after "I Want to Hold Your Hand". She certainly wasn't following or riding anyone's coattails.

-several songs that never entered the Billboard Hot 100 charted here ("Live it Up", "Guess Who", "I Don't Want to Hear it Anymore", "Who Gets Your Love", which all "Bubbled Under" the Hot 100 on Billboard)

-on the flipside of that, "In the Middle of Nowhere", "In the Land of Make Believe", "I Want to Be a Free Girl", "Mama's Little Girl" and "Let Me Love You Once Before You Go" all "Bubbled Under" on Billboard, but never appeared on Cashbox.

-there was a gap of nearly 16 months between "Losing You" and YDHTSYLM where Dusty did not appear on the chart at all (great job, Phillips!

-Dusty's most prodigious year on this chart was actually 1969, during which time she had 6 different songs appear. (the same is true of Billboard, swapping "I Don't Want to Hear it Anymore" with "Breakfast in Bed")

Click on the link below & browse by clicking the year closest to the time period you're interested in then draw the cursor along & access any issue you wish to by clicking its cover image. You can go through each available issue page by page or there's a search engine provided. Another option: click a random cover & search all available issues by checking the "Search all issues" box on the search engine. These online issues can be hard to read: to read a page I generally have to magnify it as much as possible.
