We got to talking about the Philips Recording Studio, and she said there was a bed and breakfast hotel at that location!

It's address is listed as 4 Stanhope Place.

A web search tells me that the PHilips Recording Studio was located at the basement of Stanhope House at 2-4 Stanhope Place. http://www.philsbook.com/philips.html

I always thought the recording studio was in Stanhope House which, according to Goolemaps is actually located across the street from 4 Stanhope Place where the B&B is. You know, the place with the steps leading up to the door....

So, I'm hoping one of you can solve this mystery.

Where was the Philips Recording Studio? WAs it in Stanhope House? Or was it across the street at 2-4 Stanhope Place? Or something else entireley.

I wrote to Philips in 1966 as my copy of All I See Is You did not come in a picture sleeve. The compliments slip which accompanied their response showed:

Philips Records Stanhope House Stanhope Place London W2

Stanhope House is still called that, as it turns up on Google Maps when you enter it as a location. Here is a link to it:

If you increase the map detail, Stanhope House is shown on the map. The Parkwood Hotel is shown on Google Maps as being on the opposite side of Stanhope Place from Stanhope House, which is on the corner of Stanhope Place and Connaught Place.

One of the links contained in the original posting has interior photographs of the Philips Studios. I am pretty sure that the guy sitting at the control desk in the 1959 photo is Johnny Franz.

I have had another look, but this time I have used Google Streetview to view at each property in Stanhope Place.

On the opposite side of the street from Stanhope House are nos 1 to 8, ie both odd and even nos. No 9 is on the same side as Stanhope House. It is the first property as you enter from Connaught Square. Moving towards the junction with Connaught Place the numbers go up to 12, again odd and even nos on the same side. The next property is on the corner with Connaught Pl. As the door is open I can't see the no, but assume it is 13. When you cross Connaught Pl, the next property in Stanhope Pl is Stanhope House.

I don't think that Stanhope House ever had a street number. Certainly one of its current occupiers, ie Stanhope House Estates Limited, gives its address as simply:

Stanhope House Stanhope Place London W2 2HH

I think Stanhope House has been sub-divided since the days of Philips Records. In the old days it not only housed the recording studios but also the corporate HQ for Philips Records UK until they moved to Mayfair in the 70s. It probably includes the part behind scaffolding and green plastic sheeting shown on Streetview.

Sandie Shaw recorded most of her hits at Stanhope House, because she preferred the studios there to those of Pye, her own record company. This is surprising given Dusty's complaints about the 'dead' sound at Stanhope House. Mind you, when Burt Bacharach recorded his album Hit Maker! he did it at Pye Studios in London and bemoaned the primitive nature of the equipment there.

Hope this solves things.

I might call the B&B to find out.

Unless Carole G knows. And I've recently told her that I assume she magically has every answer.

by **countrycake** For what it is worth, I think that Carole is correct. The picture she shows is clearly where the studios were located. If you use Streetview and approach Stanhope Place from Bayswater Road, you can get a better view of the front entrance of Stanhope House, which makes it clear that there is no street number on the building or on the entrance from the street.

I now find that Stanhope House Estate Limited, mentioned in one of my earlier postings, no longer exists as the company was dissolved in 2004. Here is a link to a webpage that gives details of 4 companies who appear to be currently located in Stanhope House.

Telephone nos are given, but, alas, no e-mail contact details.

The fact that 2-4 Stanhope Place has been mentioned somewhere on the net as the location of the studios does not make it true. It just means that some other mortal made a mistake, just like I made a mistake in assuming that Stanhope House Estate Limited was still in existence.

During the 60s also recorded at Olympic Studios in Barnes, London. In fact, virtually all of her early work was recorded at Trident. The tracks recorded there were All Cried Out, Anyone Who Had A Heart, Another Night, Can I Get A Witness, The Colour of Your Eyes, Don't You Know,Every Day I Have To Cry, He's Got Something, I Can't Give Back The Love I Feel For You, I Just Don't Know What To Do With Myself, I Only Want To Be With You, I Will Come To You, I Wish I'd Never Loved You, Love Power, Mama Said, Mockingbird, My Colouring Book, Needle In A Haystack, Nothing, Once Upon A Time, Something Special, Standing In The Need Of Love, Stay Awhile, Summer Is Over, Twenty Four Hours From Tulsa, When The Lovelight Starts Shining Through His Eyes,Will You Love Me Tomorrow, Wishin' and Hopin', and You Don't Own Me.

A few tracks for See All Her Faces were recorded at Trident Studios, Soho, London, eg Crumbs Off The Table, Girls It Ain't Easy and Girls Can't Do What The Guys Do.

I Close My Eyes and Count To Ten and Sweet Ride (non-soundtrack UK recording) were recorded at Chappell Studios, London.
