I know the Walker Brothers were bigger in the UK than they were here in the US, but i think there's little question Dusty was more successful.

I know your question was for the UK, Clive...but speaking for the US, Dusty was also one of the label's biggest acts. The only other artist I can think who may have been more successful here were The Four Seasons (Frankie Valli and the Four Seasons). They initially started on the Vee-Jay label (which released their earliest hits, "Sherry", "Big Girls Don't Cry", etc.), but they jumped over to Phillips at the beginning of 1964 and stayed there for the rest of the decade. Not sure of how popular they were in the UK, though.

Interesting though that as Dusty's success in US on Philips was perhaps only second to the Four Seasons that US Philips were not more keen to keep Dusty.

Thanks Wally ,Carole and Brian, I guess the Walker Brothers were nearest to Dusty's success then, if you take all their hits as a group plus solo hits.

I don't think any of Dusty's biographies have stressed that Dusty was the biggest star on Philips. It was an achievement as it was a major label. Whether it gave Dusty any more clout I don't know, perthaps it did in terms of her freedom for song selection etc.
