In its review of the opening night **Variety** opines that the score "manages variety without sacrificing its sixties-pop sound, channelling everything from the Shirelles to Cilla Black" while observing of the show overall: "**''Made in Dagenham** goes from zero to sixty in no time at all, motored mostly by laughs & tubthumping tunes. Sadly, the musical runs out of gas halfway through, thanks to a top-heavy plot & characters that don't develop enough to get your heart into gear. You root for them — they're plucky underdogs — but you don't really care for them.
