

Although her voice had already past its peak powerwise - if not expressively - I was surprised just how close to the original recordings she got this late in her career.

What always pulls down her later appearances for me though - is her often awkward stage presence. Much as the RAH concert she seems to

have difficulty in believing in Dusty Springfield the singer and staying totally focussed and immersed in the song. Maybe she wanted to relax the pressure by sending herself up. When you think of the artistic perfection of her 60s heyday it's almost like seeing a different karaoke version of herself - a very good imitator who can't take it seriously for too long.

Only a couple of years later of course and she had charting records again and restored credibility to boost her morale and poise. She seemed far more at ease toward the end of her career - I'm thinking of WIAWTG on 'Later' which was a masterclass in holding a stage while staying true to vourself.

What a fascinating and wonderful person she remained through it all.




I just watched the U-tube clip once again. I think she started to relax and seemed to have a good time on stage when she started singing SOAPM. I also love her performance of LOL on this clip.

I think your analysis is interesting, Tim. Although I see it more here than in RAH, I think that's right that she was always sending herself up, not being able to take herself seriously. At times it can be endearing, but it's almost as if she can't get through a phrase or two without having a laugh. Maybe in part because it was all "old" music.

Which brings me to the fact that I don't really like medleys. I detest them. Somehow it reduces an entire repertoire of achievement (quite substantial in Dusty's case) one long 'song' with ill fitting parts. It's frustrating, too, to not hear the full version of anything.

I agree this is a better version of LOL than at RAH. It also strikes me watching this how difficult some of her songs are to sing. IJDKWTDWM and ICMEACTT for example.

Does anyone else think Dusty is uncomfortable in her body? Or am I just projecting this? It was one of the first things I noticed about her when I first saw RAH. You don't see it in the 60s really, but it comes up later IMO.

Well bless her, I have to say, despite the 50 shoulder pads, I love the color of the outfit and the dangly bits from the jacket. She should have dressed in her favorite color more. Its'a hoot with that shock of white


