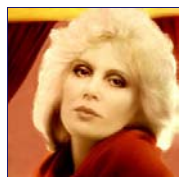

Her sitting down on the edge of the stage probably tells us something too - you know - Nancy could write a whole new paper on Dusty's body language alone...

In the 1990 interview she mentions latterly realising that pleasing people is what matters - which is strange as she was saying the very same thing in 1971! Maybe she wanted to believe it then but couldn't.

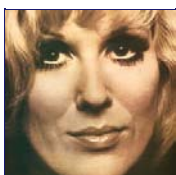
Yes Dusty's comments were interesting. It had never occurred to me before that tax considerations may have been a part of Dusty's decision to move to America.
