radio drama at all, it just seems a strange thing to do, sitting gazing into the distance whilst listening I didn't like that Dusty was bullied and not allowed phone calls but I didn't find Charlie's dramatisation of Dusty very good, she made her seem glib and sort of shallow and we know she wasn't.
