A few points - Dusty (Mary) was NEVER perfectly candid in the AA meetings about anything. She would fudge the truth at every turn and that was also true in interviews and psychiatric sessions. So Dusty had very clear limits about what she wanted to disclose.

Your earlier point that the revelations by CP and AM were "half their story to tell" um...no. Intimate moments are intimate because we are letting down our guard with someone with the implicit agreement that those moments will never be discussed with others. You do not have the right to tell the details, but I realize that people break that compact all the time. It is just a lack of decency and honour that allows people to do that - not an inherent right.

As for your last point, that Dusty must have known that betrayal was imminent, well, apparently, she did. If the story that Pat is quoted telling is correct, in her last months Dusty reeled off a list of people who would betray her after death and Vicki was at the top of the list. I'd bet my back teeth (or what's left of them) that CP was on it too. AM probably not so much - I'll bet that one would have hurt.

But it is some comfort to klnow that, for the most part, Dusty went out without any illusions about who-was-who in her life.




Promise anyone will hate on me if I try to defend Carole Pope? Ok.

The admins and mods have discussed the issue of the Carole Pope link being included on the site. You brought up very valid points, and as you've already indicated from the LTD Facebook reply, she does not have many fans here. This is true.

Speaking personally, I hardly find CP be a class act. While I do think she was genuinely fond of Dusty, sadly she has exploited the connection, divulged rather ugly details and in return has gained a small amount of notoriety (not to mention likely financial gain). And of course, their relationship occurred during an extremely difficult period in Dusty's life. The whole matter can be cringe-inducing. I totally get that.

However, a larger issue looms over this. Sort of the "big picture", if you will. And that is, in her nearly 60 years on earth, Dusty led quite a life. A rollercoaster ride of extreme highs and lows. There are periods in her life and certain activities that i know some Dusty fans would prefer not to think of ...but they DID occur. And thanks to DWD, they've become common knowledge. But yet, even with this knowledge...the fans are still there. People still remember and love Dusty. In fact, many of those who love Dusty became bigger fans AFTER reading DWD. She was not a mythic, infallible figure. She was flesh and bone, a human being who happened to be blessed with enormous talents.

If we begin to isolate or excise bits and pieces from the full story, where exactly would we draw the line? We could omit all mentions on this forum of DWD, or CP, or Lee Everett, or Peter Stringfellow, or even Vicki Wickham, or anything else of an undesirable nature, and fully sanitize Dusty's life. But what would it accomplish? Those people still exist. Those events still occurred. As Dusty fans we can focus on the positive aspects of her life, but to simply pretend the negative never existed would not solve anything. The key is striking a balance-recognizing the warts-and-all aspect, while still being respectful of an artist
