😉 The Springfields participated in a national tour headlined by Bobby Vee that ran from the end of 1961 into the first months of '62. I can only find two specific dates: on February 9 1962 the tour played the Gaumont Theater in Doncaster.



Also on the bill were Tony Orlando fresh off his no#5 hit Bless You, Jimmy Crawford the Sheffielder who'd had the UK hit of I Love How You Love Me, Bourbon street maestro Clarence "Frogman" Henry, Brighton's Suzy Cope (a regular 60s "package filler"), the Ravens (who appear to have been Jimmy Crawford's backing band) & veteran actor Billy Burden who was presumably there for comic relief. On February 21 the tour played King George's Hall in Blackburn with the lineup addition of the Checkmates (fronted by Emile Ford?)

The Del Shannon tour was actually in 1963 - here's an ad for an April 24 date at the Rialto Theatre in York which also features the names of Jerry Wallace (I gather a radio personality who'd act as m.c); the Eagles (instrumental group from Bristol); Peppi (?) & Ray Bennett (?). The same lineup played the Gaumont Theatre in Bradford on April 27 except the name of the obscure Ray Bennett is replaced by the equally obscure Ray Anton. Interestingly the previous gig but-one at the venue where the Springfields played their Bradford date was an April 6 concert headlined by Frank Ifield which featured the Lana Sisters.

Just wanted to clarify that the Lana Sisters date in Bradford in April '63 - the same month the Springfields played there - was for a Dusty-less lineup of the group. It's quite remarkable that the Lanas were still getting high-profile gigs in '63 as they don't appear to have had any record label affiliation since '60 when Dusty left the group - perhaps being the group Dusty left behind to find stardom in the Springfields gave the Lanas some cachet. Original Lana Sister Riss Chantelle re-emerged with another female trio the Chantelles in '65 so it's likely that she continued in the music business & likely as a Lana Sister during the 1960-65 period but I can't find any confirmation of either she or Lynne Abrams - the other original member - performing as Lana Sisters after Dusty's departure.

Anyway - on April 18 1963 the Springfields played Royal Albert Hall as part of a lineup supporting the Beatles in a concert that was broadcast live on BBC radio. Del Shannon & Kenny Lynch were also on the bill as were Shane Fenton (aka Alvin Stardust) & the Fentones, singer-comedian Rolf Harris, jazz singer George Melly, comic actor Lance Percival & some members of the Vernons Girls ensemble.
