The February edition of Record Collector magazine contains a news item about this documentary. The piece lists various names from the pop/rock world who will be talking about the DC5 and goes on to say, 'as well as unseen band footage from Dave Clark's personal archives of Stevie Wonder, The Rolling Stones, The Who, Dusty Springfield, The Supremes....'. RC reported that this was to be broadcast by BBC2 on 7 February. However, the BBC website shows that transmission will be on Saturday 14 February at 2205 in England and Northern Ireland, while BBC2 Scotland is showing it slightly later at 2305. BBC2 Wales has it on at 0040 in the morning of Sunday 15 February.

The info on the BBC website indicates that Dusty and others will be seen in old Ready, Steady, Go footage. As you all probably know, Dave Clark owns all surviving editions of RSG.

I quite enjoyed this programme, second half more than first. As we know, clever boy that he is, purchased a lot of tapes from the '60s. In this weeks TV schedule magazine from the "Mail" there is an article regarding this documentary. Here is a brief edited extract.

Although the master tapes of almost all the TV pop shows of that time such as RSG, Thank Your Lucky Stars and Juke Box Jury had been erased and lost forever here, DC tracked down copies that had been sold to other countries and bought up the rights to as many as he could find. He also tracked down special shows of Otis, Beatles, Stones and Dusty...... "We got all the great people" says DC. "Every time I added something from the 60s to my collection I thought it would be nice in years to come for the new generation to experience what we did".

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
