Oh Leigh. Hello! Tt's nice to see you back and I enjoyed reading what you have to say and of course I agree with you. Apart from the bit about VW and PV! I don't think they had a clue about how being bi-polar (or something close to that) may have affected Dusty. There is one fleeting reference to 'manic-depression', as far as I remember, and no attempt at an explanation of that for the reader. The book looks at Dusty but doesn't attempt to try to answer the 'why?' questions. It was written by a pretty good pop journalist and Dusty's manager - good sources for material but not great book length writers. The lack of understanding and empathy and the sensationlist slant is reflected in the title.

But I need to read the book again. There was a lot in the book that made me smile but what I remember most are the vivid images of Dusty physically hurt or in various kinds of distress. The balance of the book just wasn't right. There is a

complicated journey to, and through, DWD that has yet to be written. When (and if) it is written I hope it focuses on Dusty's work and artistry - her bedrock. I'm almost sure each album represents (or can be treated as) a milestone in Dusty's life. Tom is extremely important and always will be. I do, however, note that he said nothing about DWD. I've always wondered why.

I hope you don't get too tired to come back soon. What kind of properties are you looking at - that's what I want to know!
