

I have been to Greece twice, most recently in April of last year (also made it to Crete for three wonderful days). It's a magical place. We went just about everywhere! Where in Greece are you?

As for why I love Dusty:

Well, I enjoy many artists and some I love enough to collect all they have, such as Sting, George Michael, Erikah Badyu, Sade, and Janis Joplin. There are many artists I like quite well and think the world of but don't collect every last thing they put out.

I don't have a bad thing to say about most artists. I can usually find at least one thing I like even about the ones who annoy me.

Dusty is truly the only artist whose recordings I would want to be stranded on a desert island with.

It comes down to her instinctive understanding of the material she sung.

Her interpretation seemed to have become the true one the moment you heard it. You feel it couldn't be bettered, and it couldn't be otherwise.

You will never find a more exquisite voice than Dusty's.

Passionate and thrust are what matters. Dusty has soul, pure and simple.

I know that every artist has their own imprint, their own individual way of putting themselves inside the music. I was one of those kids who spent more time listening to music and buying records and listening to the Top Ten every Sunday morning while delvering newpapers, than anything else (except reading, and from a very young age I was reading biographies of famous singers!). I would hole up in my room and listen to records for hours on end, just about everything from rock to classical to pop, soul, r&b, you name it. I'd spend hours, days, sometimes even weeks listening to the same record over and over again. Like most who immerse themselves in what they love, I developed enough of an ear to understand what good music sounded like.

I respect and appreciate the individual expression that each artist brings to his/her music. Each singer has signature songs that belong only to them.

But I have never heard anyone put their whole soul into it the way I hear Dusty give everything to a song. She puts her self into it but not her ego.

Also, she's the most ubiquitous singer I have ever heard. I haven't quite heard anyone who could match the range of her talents in terms of the different kinds of music she could cover. Some come close but I don't really know of anyone who can cover such a range as completely as she does. That's the mark of true genuis: her instinctive grasp and the unique, elegant timbre of her voice take me farther into the song than any artist I have ever heard.

In many ways it wasn't even a conscious decision on my part. It was simply a conclusion than my gut kept coming to, over time. No matter how deeply I got 'into' other artists, Dusty was still better by far, on every possible level, than any I heard.

I hope this helps!
