As Carole's post mentioned the *Mahagonny* production in which Dusty was offered a part was an off-Broadway production: it opened 28 April 1970 & ran for eight performances. There's never been a Broadway production of the play which seems to generally be presented as an opera rather than a musical with a "run".

Lenya did originate the role of Jenny which Barbara Harris played in 1970: there is another female lead - Leokadia Begbick - played in 1970 by Estelle Parsons - who sings "Havana Song".

Dusty did mention her ideal stage role would be Carlotta Campion in Sondheim's *Follies* as she'd get to sing "I'm Still Here" & then go home! Yvonne De Carlo originated the role of Carlotta when she was forty-nine: it's kind of sad to think of Dusty at thirty-two seeing herself playing a "seen-it-all" ex-showgirl.

It is said that Dusty was offered the role of Grizabella in *Cats* which like Carlotta is a "survivor" role which by then Dusty would have been relatively age-appropriate for. There doesn't seem to be much information about the episode - if we have to guess about Dusty's disinterest I'd put it down to her having run out of confidence by the early '80s.

She could sing in many different styles; she could mimic just about any accent to perfection; she had natural comic timing; she was a great mover; she had just the right kind of acting ability for the musical theatre profession. The footage of show tunes and comedy sketches that we have confirm how absolutely comfortable she was doing this kind of thing.

I think she'd have struggled with nightly shows over a long period, and she'd have lacked confidence. But I think she had the talent. No question. She was, quite simply, incredibly gifted!
